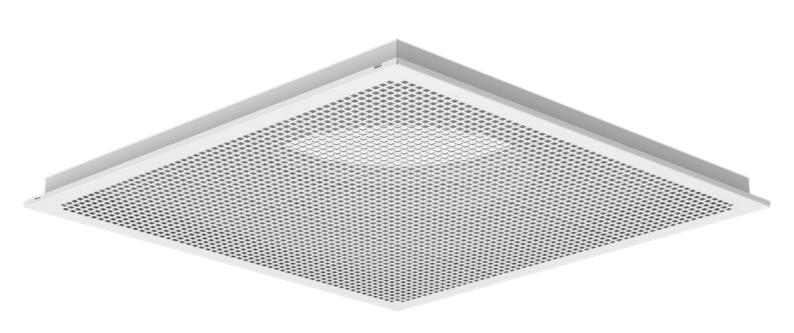

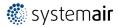

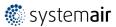

## **Product description:**

TSF is a square extract diffuser, designed for ceiling assembly. It has a perforated front plate and is mainly intended for air extract, but can be also used for air supply. The product is intended for use as air supply diffuser in offices, schools, hospitals etc.

The TSF diffusers are available in various options and sizes.

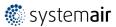

#### Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

#### Allocation:

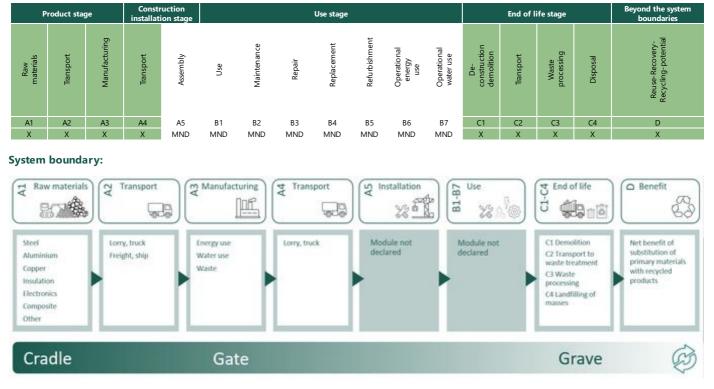
The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Energy, water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

#### Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on EPDs according to EN 15804 and different LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.

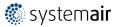




# System boundaries (X=included, MND=module not declared, MNR=module not relevant)

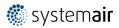

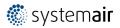

#### **Remarks to environmental impacts**

Air distribution components directly affect the pressure drop / energy efficiency of the ventilation system and consequently the operational energy use of the building. To properly evaluate the environmental performance and impact of the product, these factors must be taken into account.

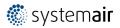

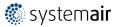

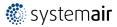
